Rest Day - Monday

Dear Friends,

This weekend we have an opportunity to step out from Lent.

Mother's Day is often called refreshment Sunday. Yes, it is permissible to eat and drink all those things that you gave up for one day. There are several schools of thoughts on this. One is that we are not like Jesus going into the wilderness for 40 days and 40 nights and living on virtually nothing. We are on the other hand unable to manage more than 20 days and for some perhaps not even that. So refreshment Sunday it is .

At the same time we can re-evaluate how we have been doing over the last few weeks and whether, as we approach Passiontide, we now want to do things a little differently.

I said in my sermon last week that sadly, we are all sinners most of the time because we are human. However, part of Lent is to look deeply into ourselves to really say sorry to God knowing that through the water of baptism he forgives us. So refreshment Sunday it is.....

We also celebrate the joy of motherhood on this Sunday. It comes with a mixed blessing because not all of us have or had a good relationship with their mother so it can invoke all sorts of difficult memories. However, regardless of our relationship with our mothers, good or bad, we have the mother of all mothers to look up to, Mary. We will ponder a little more in Holy Week about Mary, but Jesus on the cross said to the friends that were sat around the cross "Behold, here is your mother".

For those of you who are seeing family this weekend, may you have a happy and blessed time and for all of us may we come closer to God over the coming days and weeks as we journey through our pilgrimage and ultimately to the cross.
